# Pay a visit to the first McDonald's

### IF YOU GO

Take the 215 Freeway toward San Bernardino and exit Base Line. The museum is north of Base Line at the corner of 14th and E streets. The address is 1398 N. E St.

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McDonald's restaurants may be located all around the world, but San Bernardino has the rare distinction of being home to the world's first McDonald's establishment.

Take a quick a drive into old town San Bernardino to visit the very first McDonald's restaurant, which revolutionized the fast-food industry and changed America.

The establishment no longer serves food, but is now a museum which features a collection of historic McDonald's memorabilia including nostalgic signs, playgrounds and famous McDonald's characters.

The historic site of the First McDonald's Museum is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Richard and Maurice McDonald opened their first restaurant in December 1948 on the corner of 14th and E streets.

The original facility was demolished in 1972, but Albert Okura, owner of Juan Pollo, purchased the land in 1998 and had the first McDonald's restaurant rebuilt and transformed into a museum.
